About:

The Gisèle Laprise Prize was generously established by Thomson Reuters, and has been enlarged by Gisèle's family. These awards, each in the amount of \$1500, recognize an outstanding contribution by a member of CALL/ACBD to an understanding and appreciation of the civil and common law systems in Canada. The contribution may be in the form of an article, book, course, research, activities/advocacy or a body of work. The nominated material should build bridges and understanding between the Common Law and the Civil Law, something that Gisèle worked for tirelessly.

Nomination process:

- Nominations may come from any member of CALL/ACBD including, but not limited to, a reader or participant of the recommended contribution. Self-nominations are welcome.
- The nomination application should include the name, affiliation and contact information of the nominee and nominating member(s), as well as a letter explaining the reason for the nomination, with reference to the scope of the award. A copy of the article, a course description, the bibliographic citation of the book should be provided where feasible. Supporting documentation such as book reviews or course comments are encouraged.

Selection Process:

The Scholarships and Awards Committee will consider the following when evaluating a nominee:

- Does the work enhance understanding of common law and/or civil law?
- Is the work novel in its delivery or message?
- Who is the intended audience, and does the nominated work seem to meet their needs? Is there documentation to prove that the audience is benefiting from the work (evaluations, reviews)?

The Scholarships and Awards Committee will determine a winner before the early bird registration rate for the conference expires in order to encourage the winner's attendance.
